The weeks of September 15 and September 22 are High School Voter Education Weeks, where the San Bernardino County Registrar of Voters and other organizations equip our nation's high school students with the information they need to become civically involved in the communities where they live, work and play.

The San Bernardino County Registrar of Voters encourages your school to host a voter registration drive during High School Voter Education Weeks to help educate your 16- to 18-year-old students about how they can register to vote, and who is eligible to do it.
