- July 2: Deadline to certify results

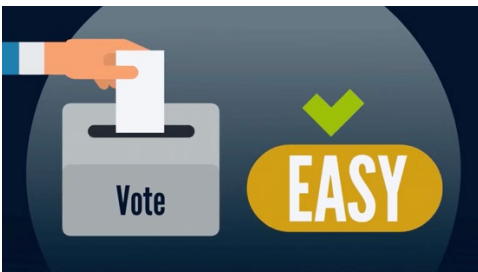

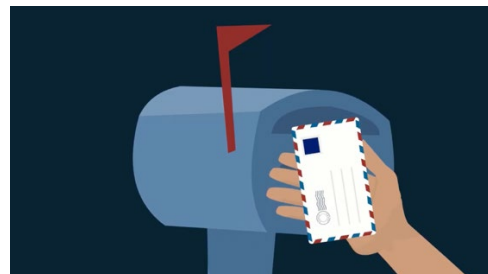

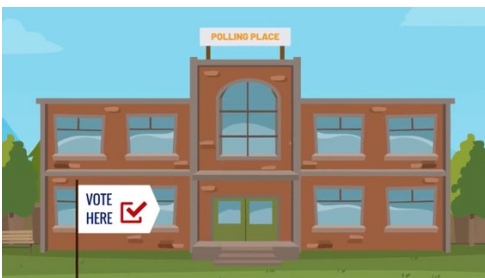

You can vote early by dropping off your ballot at a secure mail ballot drop-off location, sending your ballot back in the mail, at an Early Voting Location beginning May 28, or at the Registrar of Voters office beginning May 4. ### Article #1

#### Have You Voted Yet? Everything You Need to Know About Voting

You have the opportunity to choose how, when and where to vote for the June 2, 2026, Statewide Direct Primary Election.

You have multiple options, including voting by mail, using a mail ballot drop-off location or Early Voting Location, or in person at an Early Voting Location starting May 28 or at any polling place on June 2.

Here are the details about early voting.

1. **Mail ballots** – As of May 4, ballots were mailed to the U.S Post Office for San Bernardino County registered voters. Once received, you can cast your voted mail ballot with a pre-paid envelope in the mail, at an Early Voting Location, at a mail ballot drop-off location, or at any polling place. To be counted, mail ballots must be postmarked no later than 8 p.m. on Election Day, June 2, 2026.

If you plan to return your ballot on or close to Election Day, elections officials recommend going inside a U.S. Post Office and asking a postal clerk for a same-day manual postmark. This extra step helps ensure your ballot receives an official postmark and arrives in time to be counted.

2. **Early Voting Locations** - An Early Voting Location is a convenient way to vote early. Starting May 4, the Registrar of Voters office, located at 777 E Rialto Avenue in San Bernardino, operates as an Early Voting Location through Election Day. Beginning May 28, nine additional Early Voting Locations will be open and each will offer in-person voting. [Find an Early Voting Location.](#)
3. **Ballot drop-off locations** –You can choose from [one of many secure mail ballot drop-off locations](#) throughout the county to cast your vote. Outdoor secure mail ballot drop-boxes are bolted to the ground, and ballots are regularly picked up pursuant to State law.

If you prefer to vote in person, you can cast your ballot at any polling place in San Bernardino County on Election Day. The County's 209 polling locations will be open on June 2 from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Details can be found on the Registrar of Voters' [website](#) or on the back of your Voter Information Guide.

As you prepare to vote, remember, it's "Your Vote. Your Choice. Make it Count."

## Article #2

### Voting Early is Highly Encouraged!

For the June 2, 2026, Statewide Direct Primary Election, you have the choice of when, where and how to vote. Casting your ballot at an Early Voting Location or at one of our 77 ballot drop-off locations is the best way to avoid lines and crowds at polling places. A list of locations is available for your convenience below to cast your ballot today!

### Early Vote Locations

**1. San Bernardino County Registrar of Voters Office, 777 E. Rialto Avenue, San Bernardino, CA 92415**

- Open May 4 to June 1, Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- Closed Monday, May 25, in observance of Memorial Day
- Open Saturday, May 30, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- On Election Day, the office is open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Nine additional Early Voting Locations open on Thursday, May 28, from 10 a.m. - 6 p.m. through Election Day on Tuesday, June 2, which is open from 7 a.m. - 8 p.m. (NOTE: Early Voting Locations are not open on Sunday, May 31). The additional Early Voting Locations include:

- Apple Valley Golf Course, 15200 Rancherias Road, Apple Valley
- Dana Park Community Center, 850 Barstow Road, Barstow
- Neighborhood Activity Center, 5201 D. Street, Chino
- Joshua Tree Community Center, 6171 Sunburst Street, Joshua Tree
- Ontario Conference Center, 1947 E Convention Center Way, Ontario
- Victoria Gardens Cultural Center, 12505 Cultural Center Drive, Rancho Cucamonga
- Child Support Services (Victorville), 15400 Civic Drive, Victorville
- Yucaipa Community Center, 34900 Oak Glen Road, Yucaipa

### Mail Ballot Drop-off Locations

The County's 77 ballot drop-off locations are another safe option to vote early. Outdoor drop boxes are bolted to the concrete and ballots are collected regularly. [Find a convenient ballot drop-off location.](#)
