Highest Sales Tax

Another "Forever Tax"

Measure H has no expiration, just like Measure Q.

Another Blank Check

Measure H gives the City Council another \$32.5 million every year to spend however it wants.

Vanity Projects, Not Neighborhoods

Instead of promised neighborhood services, the City Council poured Measure Q money into massive projects, including the Ontario Sports Empire, estimated at nearly \$500 million.

They got their luxury box. We got the bill.

No Independent Oversight

Again, City Hall monitors City Hall. No Independent Citizens' Oversight. No guarantee politicians spend the money as promised.

Measure H comes down to trust. Can we trust this City Council with another blank check?

FBI Raids In Ontario

The FBI searched Councilmember Alan Wapner's home and Ontario International Airport. Ontario City Hall received a federal subpoena.

This is the worst time to give the City Council millions more in unrestricted tax money.
