Observation Schedule June 2, 2026, Statewide Direct Primary Election

The public is invited to observe as the San Bernardino County Registrar of Voters conducts a series of public events related to the election. All events will take place at the San Bernardino County Registrar of Voters office according to the following schedule:

- **April 30, 2026**
 - Election Observer Training begins at 8 a.m. and will be completed prior to the start of the Logic and Accuracy Testing.
 - Logic and Accuracy Testing of the County's ballot scanners and vote tabulation system begins at 9 a.m.
- **May 4, 2026** – Processing of mail ballot return envelopes begins at 8 a.m. and is performed daily, Monday through Friday, until the daily workload is complete.*
- **May 11, 2026** – Extraction and processing of mail ballots begins at 7:30 a.m. and is performed daily, Monday through Friday, until the daily workload is complete.*
- **May 26, 2026** – Counting of mail ballots begins at 8 a.m. and continues periodically, Monday through Friday, until the daily workload is complete.*
- **June 2, 2026** – The counting of polling place ballots begins shortly after the polls close at 8 p.m. and continues until complete.
- **June 3, 2026** – The official canvass begins at 8 a.m. and will be completed by July 2, 2026.
- **June 4, 2026** – The random precinct selection for the one percent manual tally of polling place ballots counted on the ballot scanners takes place at 10:30 a.m.
