If we want stability for Big Bear Lake neighborhoods, we need to Vote No on this measure.

Restaurant, Retail, Bike and Ski Rentals, and Recreational businesses agree that residents and local businesses deserve a balanced approach to vacation rental regulations. However, the proposed restrictions in this measure are damaging — not balanced.

With tourism now dropping below 2019 levels and new city regulations and enforcement for vacation rentals in place, we are already moving towards balance in our neighborhoods.

Big Bear Lake's vacation rental ordinance limits licenses, and is strictly enforcing occupancy, noise, parking, and spa hours. Vacation rental owners pay significant fines when the rules are broken.

This measure proposes many regulations we already have. Their new restrictions are reckless and poorly thought out. Where is their plan to compensate for a drastic reduction in tourism dollars?

Limiting vacation rentals to 30 short-term guest stays annually means homes could be empty for roughly 10 months every year. This restriction causes a 40%+ reduction in tourism spending at our local businesses — threatening the jobs and economic livelihoods of our friends, neighbors, and their families.

How can we have long-term economic stability if vacation rentals are empty for 10 months of the year?

We need to solve the housing crisis, but this measure does nothing to convert vacation rentals to workforce housing. Families struggling with the rising cost of living need urgent solutions, not damaging restrictions that lead to an unstable economy.

Let's prevent the choppy waters this measure will cause in Big Bear Lake. Please Vote No.
